This consultation statement accompanies the draft Frogmore and Sherford Neighbourhood Plan.

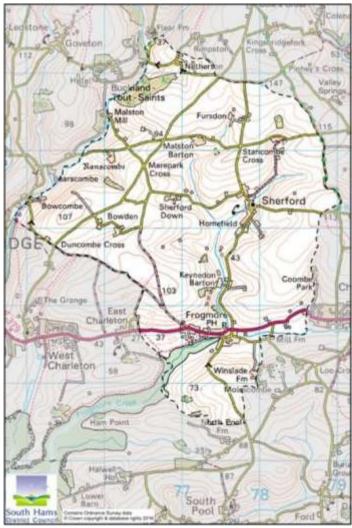
It meets the requirements laid down in the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations") and sets out:

- details of the persons and bodies who were consulted about the plan;
- an explanation of how consultation was carried out;
- a summary of the main issues and concerns raised through the consultation; and
- a description of how those issues and concerns have been considered and addressed in the plan.

The steering group is grateful to the district council, other bodies and the local community for their help and involvement in shaping the plan.

INTRODUCTION

- 1. This statement sets out the way in which the consultation undertaken as part of the Frogmore and Sherford Neighbourhood Plan meets the requirements of the Regulations.
- 2. Frogmore and Sherford Parish Council is the qualifying body responsible for the preparation, consultation and submission of the Neighbourhood Plan. It has been assisted in the process by a steering group and local consultants. The Neighbourhood Plan group's Terms of Reference are at Appendix 1.
- 3. The Frogmore and Sherford Neighbourhood Plan area has been designated as the whole of Frogmore and Sherford parish.



LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK

- 4. Part 5, paragraph 15 of the Regulations sets out the requirements for the qualifying body (Frogmore and Sherford Parish Council) to submit the plan to the local planning authority, thus:
 - 15-(1) Where a qualifying body submits a plan proposal to the local planning authority, it must include –
 - (a) a map or statement which identifies the area to which the proposed neighbourhood development plan relates;

- (b) a consultation statement;
- (c) the proposed neighbourhood development plan; and
- (d) a statement explaining how the proposed neighbourhood development plan meets the requirements of paragraph 8 of Schedule 4B to the 1990 Act.

This document fulfils requirement (b).

- 5. Section 15(2) of Part 5 of the Regulations sets out what a consultation statement (such as this one) should contain:
 - 1. details of the persons and bodies who were consulted about the plan;
 - 2. an explanation of how consultation was carried out;
 - 3. a summary of main issues and concerns raised through the consultation; and
 - 4. a description of how those issues and concerns have been considered and, where relevant, addressed in the plan.
- 6. This statement meets those requirements, particularly in that part of the statement at para's 29-36 below.

THE CONTEXT FOR THE FROGMORE AND SHERFORD NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

- 7. Frogmore and Sherford is a rural parish set at the head of one of the tributaries of the Kingsbridge estuary in south Devon. The parish population is about 440 people, and the villages still provide local facilities including the parish church and the village hall at Sherford and the pub at Frogmore.
- 8. The parish experiences the social, economic and environmental pressures and challenges commonly associated with an attractive rural location. The local economy rests primarily on tourism and agriculture. Job opportunities are few and house prices are high which can make it hard for local people, especially the young, to afford to stay in the parish. To address such issues Frogmore and Sherford Parish Council resolved to proceed with the development of a neighbourhood plan in late 2016.
- 9. The neighbourhood plan's vision for Frogmore and Sherford is:
 - "We would like Frogmore and Sherford to grow as a sustainable community meeting the needs of local people, to be an even-better place to live and work, retaining the historic character of the two villages, its rural setting and the community spirit. We want to achieve improvements in local infrastructure and enhanced facilities. Our ambition is also to protect and celebrate the rich landscapes and waterscapes within our parish."
- 10. The local community has shaped the plan, as is described below, and its policies and priorities respond to the issues and aspirations they have raised.

The Local Environment

- a) Safeguard the landscape and countryside of the parish for its own sake.
- b) Protect Frogmore Creek for its scenic beauty and wildlife value.
- c) Safeguard local heritage, not only listed buildings and Sherford Conservation Area but also undesignated heritage assets.
- d) Ensure that the peace and quiet of the locality is maintained and that views of the night sky are protected.

Development and Design

- e) Ensure that development is in keeping and in scale with the locality.
- f) Protect and promote local safety, accessibility and amenity.
- g) Promote development to meet local needs.
- h) Encourage renewable energy in scale and keeping with the locality.
- i) Ensure that development is sustainable, including during its construction.

Homes and Jobs

- i) Deliver affordable homes to meet local needs.
- k) Ensure that new developments are small scale and in keeping with the locality.
- l) Monitor the number of second homes in the parish to assess any adverse impact.
- m) Provide for small scale sustainable business growth.
- n) Enhance digital communications.

Transport, Community Facilities and Infrastructure

- o) Improve pedestrian safety.
- p) Maintain or improve public transport services.
- q) Maintain and enhance community facilities.
- r) Protect local open and green spaces.

INITIATING THE PROCESS

- 11. In late 2016 Frogmore and Sherford Parish Council resolved to prepare a neighbourhood plan. The parish council is the appropriate "qualifying body" under the Regulations.
- 12. To enable an effective start, a small representative group was established, and as the process progressed a steering group was formed and the wider parish community engaged through a series of events and surveys.

CONSULTATION UNDERTAKEN

13. The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group collected information, opinions, ideas and SWAT analyses from the parish on an extensive range of topics, grouped under, 'Parish Life', 'Homes', 'Economy' and 'Infrastructure'. Drop-in sessions were held in the parishes' two village halls, firstly during September 2017 as follows:

Saturday 9th September, 10.00 am -2.00 pm

Monday 11th September, 3.00 pm - 8.00 pm

Frogmore Village Hall

Thursday 14th September, 3.00 pm - 8.00 pm

Saturday 16th September 10.00 am - 2.00 pm

Saturday 23rd September 10.00 am - 2.00 pm

14. A questionnaire survey followed. This document is found at Appendix 5. 405 copies were hand delivered to all known adult residents and business premises in the parish in December 2017 with a latest return date of 10th February 2018.

During January 2018 the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group provided further drop-in sessions to offer assistance and to answer queries, as follows:

Wednesday 24th January 10.30 pm - 12.30 pm

All drop-in meetings were advertised locally in news media, the Parish Council's website and noticeboards and on posters.

- 15. 186 completed questionnaires were received, a 46% return rate. Some respondents noted that they were replying on behalf of themselves and a partner / family member.
- 16. The neighbourhood plan website https://frogmoreandsherford.co.uk/neighbourhood-plan shows details of helpful information including the plan area, terms of reference, steering group minutes, records of consultations and the current state of progress. The Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire results are displayed on the website

THE DRAFT NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

- 17. The plan is now published in draft form for consultation in accordance with Part 5, Regulation 14 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012. It will be open for comments for a period of 6 weeks from 21st February 2020 to 3rd April 2020. The plan and supporting documents have been made available on the Parish Council and Neighbourhood Plan websites. Hard copies of the draft plan are also available for inspection at the Sherford and Frogmore village halls on dates / times locally advertised.
- 18. Those consultation bodies prescribed in paragraph 1 of Schedule 1 of the Regulations have been consulted, along with other relevant local groups and organisations. A copy of the consultation letter/email and details of those bodies and organisations to which it was sent are at Appendix 2.
- 19. Extensive local consultation has also included:
 - a. Advertisement posters announcing the consultation period displayed on the parish public noticeboards, at the village halls, the Globe Inn and at St Martin's Church. The poster is at Appendix 4.
 - b. Publication of the consultation programme in the local newspaper, the Kingsbridge Gazette, on the Parish and Neighbourhood Plan website pages and via email circulation to the recipients of the Parish Council's 'Keep in Touch' email news sheet.
 - c. A leaflet summarising the draft plan and consultation programme delivered to every household and business premises in the parish. The leaflets request comments on the plan and includes submission details. The leaflet is at Appendix 4.
 - d. Three drop-in sessions with copies of the draft plan and exhibition display boards will be held at Sherford and Frogmore village Halls during March 2020 as follows:

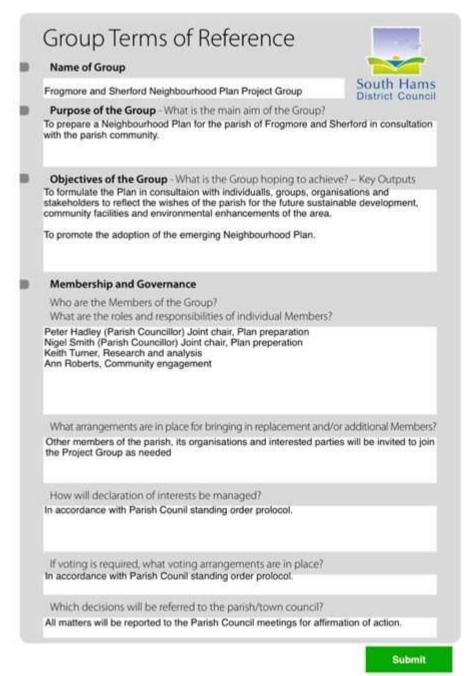

- 20. Written comments on the plan are invited via email, post, or at one of the meetings and / or via a proforma available on the parish's Neighbourhood Plan website which may be printed for delivery or submitted electronically.
- 21. Representations received, responses and any consequent changes to the plan will be set out in a Response Report. The amended plan will then be submitted to South Hams District Council, together with associated documents including the final versions of this Statement of Consultation, the Basic Conditions Statement, and if required, the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and/or Habitats Regulations Assessment (HRA), the Monitoring Report, and a scheduled Evidence Base.
- 22. The District Council will arrange for the plan's examination by an independent examiner who will decide whether it meets the basic conditions. If these conditions are considered to have been met the District Council will hold a local referendum on the plan. So long as more than 50% of those voting in the referendum support the plan it will be declared "duly made" and will become part of the development plan and statutory planning decision making framework for the parish.

Steering Group Terms of Reference

1.00 Purpose of the Group

1.01 To Prepare a Neighbourhood Development Plan for the Parish, in consultation with the wider community, local groups and interested parties.

2.00 Objectives of the Group

- **2.01** To facilitate the process of achieving an adopted Neighbourhood Development Plan for the future development and sustainability of the Parish of Frogmore and Sherford.
- 2.02 The Neighbourhood Plan will be produced with due consideration for the needs of all residents, businesses at stake-holders in the area.
- **2.03** The Neighbourhood Plan will seek to improve the social, economic and environmental well-being of the area and those residing within it.

3.00 Membership & Governance

3.01 The Steering Group shall achieve the following goals in partnership with the Parish Council:

- Manage and co-ordinate the production of a draft Neighbourhood Plan that is representative of local views.
- Co-ordinate effective engagement with all members of the community on a number of aspects relating to the Neighbourhood Plan.
- Effectively communicate findings, ideas and approaches for the Neighbourhood Plan to the Parish Council and the wider community.
- d. Identify support, resources and funding needed for stages of the process.
- e. Manage the decision-making process in an open, transparent and accessible way.
- Identify, where appropriate, specific strategies to accommodate development, that may be necessary, consistent with Joint Local Plan policies.
- g. Consider policies suitable for the Parish as part of maintaining a balanced and happy community.
- h. Produce appropriate timescales and delivery mechanisms for the Neighbourhood Plan.
- i. Produce a Neighbourhood Plan that is consistent with national and district policies.
- j. Take the Neighbourhood Plan to adoption by the District Council.
- **3.02** Membership of the Steering Group will comprise up to 12 volunteers at any one time. The group will include at least 2 members of the Parish Council. Members will be expected to exercise balanced consideration for the needs of all aspects of the local community.
- **3.03** Members may be excluded from the Steering Group for conduct and behaviour that is disruptive and does not promote the aims and objectives of the Steering Group. Exclusion of members will by a majority vote of the Steering Group.
- **3.04** The Steering Group shall not be affiliated to any political party, but will welcome the involvement of other Parish, District or County Councillors on aspects relevant to the Plan.
- 3.05 Declarations of Interest will be dealt with as per the Parish Council's Standing Orders, in that anyone who has a pecuniary interest in the policy/project under discussion will be asked to declare

it, and if deemed necessary will not take part in that discussion. This may include membership of an organisation, ownership of land or a business, or any other matter that may be considered to be relevant. Such declarations shall be recorded and be publicly available

- 3.06 Organisations and businesses may assist in the production of the Neighbourhood Plan and may contribute to the cost of producing it. Details of any donations or assistance must be made publicly available and must not influence the recommendations of the plan.
- 3.07 The community will be encouraged to share knowledge and contribute during the process. A minimum of five voting members of the Steering Group will represent a quorum enabling the aims and objectives of the Group to be considered.

4.00 Reporting and Feedback

- 4.01 The Steering Group shall meet as frequently as may be required during the Plan development period, accepting that evidence gathering, research, public consultations and the Plan development initiatives, in addition to Steering Group meetings, will drive the programme. Previous meeting minutes and agenda items will be circulated to members at least 5 working days prior to Steering Group meetings.
- 4.02 Any matters of disagreement at a meeting may be decided upon by a majority of votes. Voting by Members of the Steering Group will be by a show of hands, and a majority decision adopted, with a quorum of five required for any vote, the Chairman having a casting vote if necessary.
- 4.03 All meetings, minutes and notices will be in the public domain and will be put on the Parish Council's website, copies will be kept by the Parish Clerk for public inspection. Any contentious issue not able to be dealt with by the Steering Group, will be put to the Parish Council for resolution.

5.00 Resources and Finance

- 5.01 Grant funding applications from the MCLG Community Locality Fund will be applied for. South Hams District Council will be asked to provide information and guidance through-out the Plan preparation process.
- 5.02 The Parish Council will monitor the expenditure and programme of work as advised by the Steering Group, in consultation with the community. Any recommendation to amend the numbers of the Steering Group, or change the projects/policies already confirmed, will be referred to the Parish Council for a decision.

6.00 Monitoring & Review

6.01 Monitoring of the plan will be ongoing, with regular reports from the Steering Group, and progress will be monitored by the Parish Council. The adoption of a Neighbourhood Development Plan is considered important to ensure a vibrant, sustainable and environmentally healthy Parish for future generations.

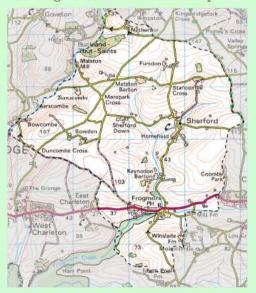

- The Neighbourhood Plan will be drafted with help from our planning advisers, Devon Halo.
- The draft Plan will be made available to view via email, website and in print at Frogmore and Sherford village halls for parishioners and stakeholders to review.
- The final draft will then be put to a referendum to be voted on by all registered on the electoral role.
- Once approved by a simple majority vote, the Neighbourhood Plan will be adopted and becomes part of the statutory planning process.

WHAT IS NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING?

The Ministry of Housing, Communities & Local Government's guidance explains aspects of the neighbourhood planning system introduced in the Localism Act:

- Neighbourhood planning gives communities direct power to develop a shared vision for their neighbourhood and shape the development and growth of their local area.
- They are able to choose where they want new homes, shops and offices to be built, have their say on what those new buildings should look like and what infrastructure should be provided, and grant planning for the new buildings they want to see go ahead.
- Neighbourhood planning provides a powerful set of tools for local people to plan for the types of development to meet their community's needs and where the ambilion of the neighbourhood is aligned with the strategic needs and priorities of the wider local area.'



BACKGROUND

The neighbourhood plan covers the entire parish area and will help shape the future for our community.

South Hams District Council approved the designated area in March 2017 and a volunteer Neighbourhood Plan steering group, reporting to the Frogmore and Sherford Parish Council, was established.

Government funds have helped meet professional consultant costs and our community consultation programme. Public meetings culminated in the issue of a parish wide neighbourhood plan questionnaire survey in 2018. A total of 186 completed questionnaires were returned and an analysis is published on the neighbourhood plan website.



NEXT STEPS

Once necessary amendments are made, the draft plan will be submitted to South Hams District Council who will arrange for an independent expert examination.

It will then be put to a referendum to be voted on by all on the parish electoral register.

LOCAL CONTEXT

The parish is home to about 440 people. Frogmore village comprises some 180 dwellings. Over 40% were built during the 1960s-80s. Approximately 50 of the homes are housing association owned, let at affordable rents. Sherford village has some 45 dwellings in an historic village setting.

The parish lies partly within the South Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Sherford's village centre is a designated Conservation Area.

The parish has an agricultural heritage. There are also maritime, construction services, tourism and hospitality businesses. A number of small home and workshop-based businesses flourish.

The area has also long been attractive to those in retirement, many remaining engaged in community and voluntary activities.

With relatively few local job opportunities and prevailing high house prices it can be hard for people, especially the young, to find suitable employment and affordable homes in the parish.

The Plymouth & South West Devon Local Plan supports sustainable community policies and neighbourhood plans.

The local community expects the plan to:

- sustain and enhance quality of life in the parish.
- enable new homes to be available, including affordable homes for local people,
- support existing and new businesses and job opportunities,
- maintain and improve community facilities, services and infrastructure.

THE VISION

89% of questionnaire respondents concurred with the statement:

- The plan aims to foster conditions for local economic prosperity and sustainable local business growth.
- The reuse of agricultural and redundant buildings for small business and workshop premises will be encouraged to assist local employment growth.
- Appropriate scale new business premises, visitor and tourist accommodation and associated facilities will generally be supported.

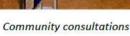
It will address social, economic and environmental issues (including housing, employment, heritage and transport).

And the process?

The Parish Council set up a Neighbourhood Plan steering group at the beginning of 2017. There are presently nine volunteer members. The Department for Communities and Local Government subsequently provided grant funding to cover the costs of preparing the Plan. Many parishioners contributed initial views and ideas about the Plan during the recent 'drop-in' presentation meetings held at Frogmore and Sherford village halls. These have helped shape this questionnaire.

This questionnaire is now being delivered to residents and businesses throughout the parish. Once there are returned and the results are analysed, the Neighbourhood Plan will be drafted by the steering group with professional support. It will then be made available for further community consultations after which it will go to South Hams District Council for independent examination. Parishioners registered on the electoral role will then be invited to vote on it in a referendum. A simple majority will determine the result. The diagram below illustrates the step in the process and we have now reached step 4.



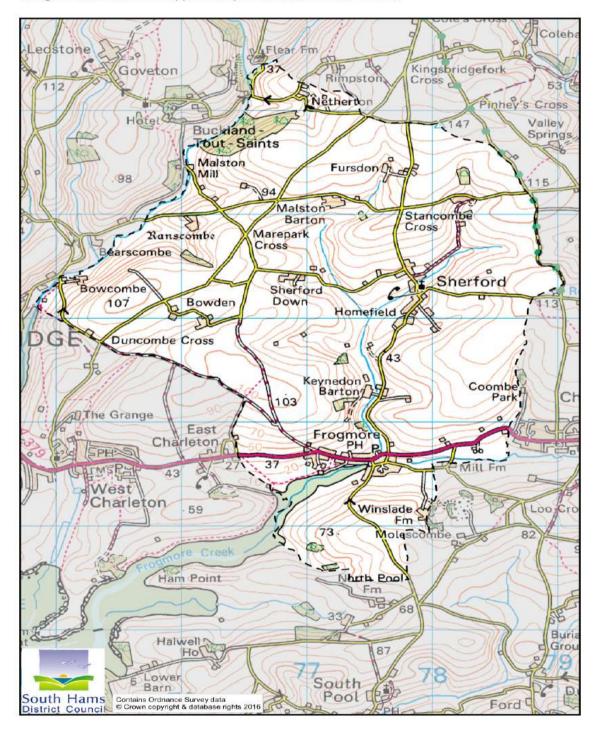
